FROM THE MINISTER'S DESK

Singing hymns is always a favorite part of worship. The words are meaningful. The tune is inspiring. And when the words and melody come together so beautifully, it truly is a wonderful, worshipful experience.

Hymns are an incredibly important part of our worship services. Not only are they a time in which we praise God together in one voice, but they are also where most of us first learn theology. I love the hymns I sang as a child, hymns where I learned that Jesus loves me, that God's grace is amazing. And of course I have favorites – don't we all? But I also really enjoy learning new hymns.

You may have noticed that we have been singing a new hymn in worship these past few weeks. "God, beyond Our Ways of Knowing" is a beautiful new hymn written by Adam M. L. Tice, written to follow the Lectionary scriptures of this Lenten season. Each week, when Duane and I meet to choose the hymns we will sing in worship, we try to thoughtfully and intentionally choose hymns that go with the scripture for that Sunday. So when Duane introduced me to this hymn, which has a verse inspired by each of the Gospel texts for the first five Sundays of Lent, I knew that singing it every week would add meaning to our worship experience as well as our Lenten journey.

Adam Tice, the hymn's author, is a "Hymn Society friend" of Duane who lives in Goshen, Indiana, and is ordained for ministry in Mennonite Church USA. He regularly leads workshops, presents, and leads singing at conferences and events locally and nationally. In 2016 he was named text editor for the Mennonite Worship and Song Committee. In 2004 Adam was named a Lovelace Scholar by the Hymn Society of the United States and Canada. From 2007 to 2010 he served as a member of the Society's Executive Committee. He began a term as Editor of the Society's journal in 2018.

The tune which we have chosen to accompany "God, beyond Our Ways of Knowing" is IRBY, a popular Christmas tune, originally written for children by John Henry Gauntlett in 1849, and is usually associated with the carol "Once in Royal David's City." It opens the annual Festival of Lessons and Carols at King's College, Oxford, England, each Christmas Eve.

As we continue to sing this hymn together in worship, we encourage you to notice the words of the second verse (it will change each week) ... notice how it illuminates the themes of the scripture for the day. We pray that this hymn, as well as every aspect of worship, inspires you as we journey together to the cross with Jesus.

God, beyond our ways of knowing, you invite us into grace, shepherd us to guide our growing, help us seek and find our place: teaching us through Christ to live in the blessings that you give.

Faithful Christ, you never leave me comfortless or all alone though temptation may deceive me, though my voice may ache and moan; for the day the prophets sought is fulfilled in what you taught

If I choose to rise and follow, I must seize upon the cross – other fortunes now ring hollow other profits count as loss. Christ, come lift me when I fall, stumbling as I heed your call.
