FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Members and Friends of Bethany Christian,

Miriam joins me in expressing our pleasure at your giving us opportunity again to lead as interim pastor of the church. (Most of you recall our being with you in the same role between 2004-2006. That was ten years ago.) The world and the church have moved on, as Ross Dorneman made clear in his excellent August 9 message. The truth of God's incredible and unfathomable love "was, is, and ever shall be," but the wrapping in which the truth comes to us has changed, and must change to meet the needs of each generation. We must recognize what those needs are and find all legitimate ways to focus God's passionate love upon them. Sometimes, people get the wrong idea about the meaning of "interim." They think of it as a time in which the church is not working at full strength – a kind of holding action between two more-orless settled ministries. Some use the term "full time minister" to contrast with "interim minister." No, the interim is as "full time" as the settled minister for whom the church will be searching. The difference between the two is very simple – the interim minister's stay with the church is set for a specific period; the settled minister's is open-ended.

I will begin my ministry on **September 1** in the office from 10:00 to 2:00. My door will be open, as it was when I was here before, and as it will be Tuesdays and Thursdays during this ministry. Come by, and tell me what's on your mind.
